The meeting of the National Center For Research Resources Special Emphasis Panel ZRR1 CM-2 01, Comparative Medicine was convened on November 25, 2003, at 2:30 p.m., at the Office of Review, 6701 Democracy Blvd., Room 1080, Bethesda, MD. John K. Critser, AB, BA, MS, Chairperson presided as chair. The roster includes all members of the panel. Others in attendance are either listed on the roster or on the visitor log.

1 Resource-Related Research Projects application requesting \$2,430,668 in support.
